Dental Hygienist & Assistant

Dental hygienists examine patients for signs of oral diseases, such as gingivitis, and provide preventive care such as oral hygiene. They educate patients about oral health and ways to keep their teeth and gums healthy. Hygienists remove stains and polish teeth and take x-rays to check for tooth or jaw problems. They use hand, power, and ultrasonic tools and sometimes lasers. **Dental assistants** perform patient care, recordkeeping, and appointment scheduling. They may take patient medical history, blood pressure, and pulse before a procedure and explain procedures and educate on oral care. They help dentists during a procedure by passing instruments and holding equipment such as suction hoses, matrix bands, and dental curing lights. Duties can vary by state and by dental office.

Dental hygienists typically need an associate's degree in dental hygiene, but also may get a bachelor's degree. Master's degree programs are available but are relatively uncommon. A bachelor's or master's degree usually is required for research, teaching, or clinical practice in public or school health programs. Programs are often found in community colleges, technical schools, and universities. To become a dental assistant in New York State a licensure-qualifying dental assisting program must be completed. They are typically one year in length and available at community colleges and local BOCES and lead to a certificate or a diploma.

What Does a Dental Hygienist and Assistant Do?



<u>Hygienist</u>

- Remove tartar, stains, plaque from teeth.
- ✓ Apply sealants and fluorides to help protect teeth.
- ✓ Take and develop dental x-rays.
- ✓ Assess patients oral health and report findings to dentists.
- Document patient care and treatment plans.
- Educate how to brush and floss correctly.



Assistant

Prepare patients and work area for treatment/procedures.

- Sterilize instruments.
- ✓ Hand instruments to dentist and dry patient mouths using equipment.
- ✓ Process x rays and complete lab tasks, under the direction of a dentist.
- Record keeping and scheduling patient appointments.
- ✓ Billing and payment
