The Western New York Rural Area Health Education Center's Rural Broadband Healthcare Network (RBHN) is a consortium of providers in rural, urban, and medically underserved areas that qualify and participate in the FCC's Healthcare Connect Fund.

This process allows us to ease the administrative burden on our consortium members and saves organizations both time and money. Since 2015, consortium members have saved over \$13 million.
