Respiratory Therapist

Respiratory therapists care for patients who have trouble breathing by examining them, performing diagnostic tests, developing treatment plans with doctors and then educating patients on their plans. They may work in emergency rooms, intensive care units, outpatient clinics, nursing homes, or sleep centers. Some specialize in working with infants and babies, or with seniors.

Average Annual Pay: \$61,830


How Do I Become A Respiratory Therapist?

Projected Job Market Growth: 14% by 2031

Complete an Associate Degree in respiratory therapy. Some employers may prefer a bachelor's degree. Following, complete a credentialing exam from the National Board for Respiratory Care and then earn state licensure. Certification must be maintained. Respiratory therapists are required to be licensed in all states except Alaska.

What Does A Respiratory Therapist Do?

- Examine patients with breathing or cardiopulmonary disorders
- · Consult with physicians about a patients' condition and develop a treatment plan
- Perform diagnostic tests such as assessing lung capacity and analyzing oxygen and carbon dioxide level



- Treat patients using a variety of methods
- Monitor and record patients' progress
- · Clear airways for improved breathing
- Connect patients to ventilators
- Set up and monitor equipment
- Teach patients how to take medications and use equipment
